





The Forum was located at 162 Albert Street, in the Brisbane CBD. A purpose-built cinema, it was owned and operated exclusively by Greater Union Theatres. The auditorium and foyers featured an Italian Renaissance décor. The wraparound stage curtains extended from wall-to-wall and down in a stepped arrangement as far as the front rows of the Orchestra and Balcony sections of the auditorium. The cinema opened on Thursday, 6th November, 1967 with a gala premiere of the film, A Man for All Seasons. It opened to the public the following day and quickly became GU's premiere, first-run cinema in Brisbane. The Forum comprised a two-level auditorium, with separate Orchestra and Balcony sections and a total seating capacity of 984. The Orchestra section was set on a moderately raked (sloping) floor, whilst the Balcony was set on a steeper and stepped rake. Each row of seats was straight (not curved) and there was a significant setback distance from the stage and screen to the first row of seats in the Orchestra section. The cinema was 70mm capable with Victoria 8 projectors. The Forum's first 70mm film was *Funny Girl*, which opened on the 21st March, 1969. Many other 70mm openings and reissues followed, including: Sweet Charity, a reissue in 70mm of Paint Your Wagon, [which had originally opened in 35mm 4Track Magnetic at the George, Brisbane] and an MGM 70mm Festival consisting of **Doctor Zhivago**, **Ben-**Hur, The Dirty Dozen and Gone with the Wind. It is also worth noting that Airport enjoyed the longest 70mm season at the Forum during the Roadshow Engagement period. Interestingly, the film was only advertised as screening in 70mm from the 31/07/1970 - towards the end of the film's 21-week season. The Forum was twinned in 1982 reopening on Wednesday, 15th September, 1982, with the Balcony (the larger of the two cinemas) becoming Cinema 1. A new bio was constructed at the back of the Orchestra/Stalls section of Cinema 2. Both cinemas were 70mm capable with Victoria 8 projectors. The twin cinema became known as Greater Union Cinemas 4 and 5; the threescreen Greater Union Cinemas 1 to 3 having been created out of the former Metro Theatre - also located in Albert Street. The latter would be known by several names - Albert Cinemas and Brisbane City Cinemas.

Please Note - It has not been possible to confirm whether *The Boyfriend* screened in 70mm at the Forum. Our research for **Australia in 70mm** has found no tabloid advertising or sessions directory promoting the film in 70mm. Accordingly, the film title and season details will remain highlighted in BLUE cells until confirmed either way.
