

PORGY AND BESS was photographed in Todd-AO. The Australian season opened two refurbished cinemas in Australia. Both of which were equipped for 70mm and managed by the exhibitor, Greater Union. First was the Majestic in Melbourne which had closed on the 25th February 1960 for the installation of 70mm and reopened on the 10th June 1960 with PORGY AND BESS as the Chelsea Cinema. The second was the Lyric in Sydney, closing on the 5th February 1960 and after an extensive refurbishment, reopened with PORGY AND BESS in 70mm on the 23rd June 1960 as the Forum cinema. There was two 70mm prints of PORGY AND BESS in circulation in Australia.

SPARTACUS was shot in 35mm 8-perf Technirama and optically enlarged to Super Technirama 70. The Australian Premiere was at the Chelsea Melbourne on the 8th December 1960. There were two

70mm prints of **SPARTACUS** in circulation in Australia. For the capital cities Perth, Brisbane, Hobart and Canberra, **SPARTACUS** was presented in 35mm.
