





Techniscope was a two perf motion picture camera negative format introduced by Technicolor in Italy in 1960. The first film to use this process was The Pharaoh's Woman. The system was in use for about 15 years, being used mainly on low-budget productions. Noteworthy titles include the Sergio Leone spaghetti western cycle - the most popular being The Good, The Bad and The Ugly. Other films shot in the process include The Ipcress File, Alfie and American Graffiti. Raid on Rommel appears to have been the only Techniscope blow up to 70mm.




