

The International 70 MM Association

The intention of the 70 MM Association is to get more people involved in bringing back the 70 mm films on to the screens of cinemas, also through international contacts.

By more publicity in papers and magazines we want moviegoers to be informed of the differences between 35 and 70 mm films. Also we want to try to convince producers that one of the ways of getting more people into the cinema is to have a large 70 mm screen with 6-channel stereophonic sound: they have a small screen at home: their television and video!

we shall also make lists of theatres that are still capable of snowing 70 mm films, and lists of "reasonable" copies of old 70 mm films, shorts and trailers.

If possible we would like to preserve the original 65 mm negatives of the old 70 mm films.

We should very much like interested people to collect all the advertisements and publications about 70 mm films and 70 mm theatres that appear in papers, etc., and send these to the secretary of the 70 MM Association in the Netherlands. The membership is for everyone who likes to assist with plans for the re-issue of 70 mm films. 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Kinepolis Brussels:

The return of the 70 MM theatre!



Sentember 29th, 1988, A historic date in the world of film theatres in Belgium. With Kinepolis a new breed of cinema is born. The theatre you will soon discover definitely belongs to the future. Actually, it is concieved as a double theatre with two houses built above one another and with two projection rooms. As the unchallenged leader in Europe, Kinepolis will start with 9 screens (including an Imax house) and eventually develop in one of the world's largest theatres with its total amount of 6,500 seats and 23 screens offering an unprecedent attacking of the figurations.

Thanks to the experience this dynamic team has achieved in the past years at Harelbeke (Majestiek), Hasselt (Trioscoop), Liège (Les Opéras and le Palace), Ghent (Decascoop) and Courtrai (Pentascoop) and thanks to the input of state-of-the-art technology from the United States (Figeralia was conseived) from the United States, Kinepolis was conceived under ideal circumstances. On considering the initial plans, they decided that your very comfort would be the key to all their investigations, i.e. on every possible level. Be it the quality of the projection, the image and the sound or the design of the seats. Kinepolis has the following in store:

huge screens (the largest with a width of 28 yards, the smallest with a width of 13 yards). Dolby Stereo for all screens. It is a system that guarantees a more natural sound, for what you get to hear is the sound the director heard in the studio. Moreover, most of the new productions are recorded in Dolby Stereo.

4 screens equipped for projections in 70 mm.

As is the case with Dolby Stereo, this is also a must. Especially because it has appeared that more and more films will be accompanied by a 70 mm copy. Traditional copies are made on 35 mm format. Features such as Apocalypse Now, The Right Stuff and more recently Top Gun just ought to be viewed in 70 mm and in Dolby Stereo. To movie-goers the 70 mm Dolby Stereo is the equivalent of the compact-disc to buyers of hi-fi.

Normally, a film is shown at a speed of 24 images per second. Showscan has a speed of 60 images per second. The Showscan theatre is designed in such a way that the audience really has the feeling to participate. The screen covers the entire surface of the wall sc that you cannot possibly miss anything. IMAX - THE DREAM IS ALIVE

Though Kinepolis offers no less than 23 screens, the Imax house is undoubtly the pièce de résistance within the walls of this huge pièce of modern architecture. Indeed, this revolutionary concept leaves the 70 mm Dolby Stereo far behind. Imax uses the largest film frame in motion picture history. ten times the size of a conventional 35 mm and three times the size of a 70 mm frame.

A totally new camera and projector were designed to cope with such a huge frame. Because the Imax film frame is ten times the size of a 35 mm movie frame, the screen can also be ten times the size of a conventional screen. The Imax screen is not only wider than e.g. Cinerama, but also dramatically taller than any previous movies screen, and thus the effect is far more compelling than wide-screen alone. 


CineSpace 70, Big and New at SMPTE

Todd-AO, a company involved memorably in the making of some of the outstanding big screen productions of the past, introduced its new CineSpace 70 series of cameras at a special meeting of the American Society of Cinematographers on August 10. In the excellent screening room at Glen Glenn Sound in Hollywood, an impressive demonstration of the capabilities of the new cameras met with enthusiastic approval by a gathering of top cinematographers and film industry technical experts.

The presentation consisted of two reels of *Oklahoma!* which was filmed by Todd-AO 33 years ago, followed by a group of test films made with the new equipment under a variety of conditions and utilizing many new lenses. Commentary was supplied by Dr. Richard Vetter, technical director of United Artists Communication; Buzz Knudson, president of Todd-AO; Doug Fries, head of Fries Engineering; Lee Parker, producer of the demo films; and Jack Cooperman, ASC program chairman.

It was clear from the statements of Knudson and Vetter that the systems were developed in the conviction that the future of theatrical motion pictures lies in wide film presentation.

"Everything has been vastly improved - cameras, film stock, lenses - yet we were seeing better images on the screen 30 years ago," Vetter noted. The Oklahoma! footage proved his point eloquently. Produced in 70mm and photographed at 30 fps, the musical evidenced visuals superior to any recent theatrical releases. "The majority of present day moviegoers have never seen 70mm features photographed on wide film." Vetter pointed out that less than half the capabilities of present 35mm film reaches the screen, and that the present 1.85 ratio crops off 40% of the image. "Blowups



to 70mm from 35mm are brighter and bigger, but have no better definition."

After the Oklahomal screening, Knudson said that Todd-AO is dedicated to "bringing back that kind of quality." The assemblage of cinematographers responded enthusiastically.

CineSpace 70 is available in a studio sound model and in a "wild" MOS model which can be hand-held or used with Steadicam. The MOS camera is crystalled at 24, 30 and 60 fps and can be driven at higher speeds. It weighs just over 30 lbs, considerably less than the bulky 70mm equipment of the past. It can be used for time-lapse, aerial work, underwater photography and slow-motion work. It uses 350-ft. or 1000-ft. magazines.

The sound camera, with crystal speeds of 24 or 30 fps, is notably quiet, compact and lightweight. Both models were adapted from the Mitchell AP cameras by Fries Engineering Co.


